

# Shipping Alcoholic Beverages

## ***Alaska State Law Requires:***

If you are transporting alcohol by common carrier (such as in your carry-on baggage, checked baggage, or shipped package) to an area that restricts the sale of alcohol, you must clearly LABEL in plain view the shipping container as

### **ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES**

in **at least** 2 inch high letters in contrasting colors and attach clearly and in plain view **an itemized receipt** or list noting the type, quantity and value of the alcohol inside.



This labeling law requirement applies if you are transporting more than:

- two liters of wine; *or*
- one gallon of malt beverages; *or*
- one liter of distilled spirits.

NOTE: Telling airline personnel that you are carrying alcohol in your baggage or boxes is **NOT** considered a defense.

Violating the labeling law is a class A misdemeanor CRIME punishable with a **\$10,000 fine and / or up to 1 year in jail.**  
(AS 04.16.125)
